Your Chamber Working For You

n the heels of being one of the strongest San Gabriel Valley advocates for the successful funding of the Metro Gold Line Foothill Extension coming to Arcadia and beyond, your Arcadia Chamber has successfully advocated the following:

• Downtown Business Association funding approval: Your Chamber sparked the formation of the group last year, which last month won unanimous City Council approval to hire a City-funded professional consultant at more than \$18,000. The City also approved a \$93,000 study of parking improvements Downtown.

• Temporary banners code revisions: The City Council recently acknowledged your Chamber's strong and helpful advocacy that led to the City revising its codes that will ensure that businesses do not allow temporary banners on their shops to become permanent eyesores and to skirt requirements for business signs regarding size, placement, and amount of text in English.

Recently your Chamber took official positions and wrote strong letters supporting the following:

• Do not eliminate Redevelopment Agency funding: In letters to Governor Brown and all state representatives of Arcadia, your Chamber pointed out that Redevelopment projects have included 19 office buildings, for restaurants, and two retail buildings and nearly \$5 million for the construction of the new police and fire stations. Elimination of these funds would impact seed money for the Downtown Business Association and façade rehabilitation for Downtown businesses, and would prevent work on the integration of the Gold Line station into the Downtown area design and plan.

•Proceeding with the 57/60 Confluence Project: Initial \$35 million in local funding and \$8.75 mil. in Metro funding for improvements to the dangerous and congested traffic flow that could be completed by 2016.

• Repaving westbound lanes of Huntington Drive between Holly Ave. and Baldwin Ave in August/September will require lane closures.






